Summary

The San Jose Buddhist Church Betsuin (SJBCB) made great strides in resuming inperson activities that had been on hiatus or curtailed since early 2020 due to the COVID outbreak. Resumption of social gatherings and celebrations - such as the New Year's luncheon and Keiro Kai - and the introduction of new activities (weekly pickleball sessions) emphasized the importance of the SJBCB to church members and the local community. New friendships were made and friendships strengthened as the SJBCB supported not only its own Sangha but also those encountering unexpected hardships (temples in Lahaina, HI; Seattle, WA; and Watsonville, CA).

2025 promises to be an exciting and busy year as momentum for the new Dharma Center grows. We are planning to break ground in late-2025! The Dharma Center is a new 11,000 sq-ft, state-of-the-art. two-story building that will replace the existing Education building. The building will provide more facility space and serve as a new home to the Lotus Preschool, Dharma School, and Japanese Language School. The Dharma Center is expected to rejuvenate the landscape of San Jose Japantown.

The SJBCB Board of Directors continues to evaluate new strategies to insure solvency of the temple well into the future.

- Our Coast District BWA members did an outstanding job coordinating and hosting the BCA Federation of Buddhist Women's Associations Conference in San Jose.
- We celebrated Sumi Tanabe's many accomplishments at a special lunch, attended by many whom she has mentored and inspired.








Highlights from 2024 (continued)

- We teamed with Yu Ai Kai, Wesley United Methodist Church, and Nikkei Matsuri Foundation to host a community Keiro Kai for 250+ people.
- We hosted 3 Techno Hoyo services, sponsored by the BCA and led by a guest minister from Japan. The services comprised chanting to electronic beats and stunning light displays in a darkened Hondo.
- Our Junior YBA membership continued to grow and is now the largest Jr.YBA in the BCA. We were the largest group to attend the Central Coast Conference.
- Our Scouting groups hosted fundraisers for their trips/activities (e.g., Maui trip, Thinking Day) while supporting many church events - thank you Scouts!
- Attendance at Lotus Pre-School and Japanese Language School returned nearly to pre-COVID levels.
- For the first time, we expanded our Obon Festival space to include Jackson Street in order to be more inclusive of Japantown businesses. We had over 2700 dancers during the weekend - a new record!

Dharma Center - Plans for 2025

Since approximately 2010, plans have evolved to replace the aging Education Building. The new \$16M, 11,000 sq-ft building, known as the Dharma Center, will contain a multi-purpose room, library/media center, conference room, and outdoor space adjacent to the building. Fundraising for the Dharma Center began in earnest in 2020 and continued through the building approval process with the City of San Jose. With approximately \$11M raised to date from generous donors and many fundraisers by SJBCB organizations, aggressive fundraising in 2025 is needed to close the \$5M gap. Ground breaking is expected in late-2025.







The Phase II Building Committee (focused on interfacing with the architect, builders, and city), the Fund Development Committee (focused on fundraising, high-level strategy), and the Marketing/Communication Committee (focused on outreach to the Sangha and community) have a number of activities and tasks planned for 2025, including:

- Re-vamping the Dharma Center website
- Briefing community organizations on the role of the Dharma Center as a community center
- Hosting and leveraging events to raise awareness and funds for the Dharma Center


Financial Summary and Plans for 2025


In FY24, total revenue was approximately \$785.5K and total expenses were approximately \$975.3K, leaving a deficit of roughly \$189.8K which was balanced using budget reserves. The sources for revenue and expenses are shown in the unaudited charts below. Increased compensation to payroll, refrigeration repairs, and other one-time maintenance costs contributed to the deficit.

Revenue streams and expenses for FY25 are being reviewed. Obon revenue is

expected to increase in FY25. Outreach efforts to increase the number of duespaying members is already underway. Membership dues will increase by 8.3% - the first increase in over 10 years. Rental fees for temple facilities and properties will increase modestly.

Additional strategies are being developed by the Board of Directors to balance future budgets through increased revenue and reduced spending, and to build reserves to cover future capital outlays.
